Getting around the Solitude Mountain Resort base areas is easy. The two primary locations for all services are the village and Moonbeam areas. Follow the directions below and refer to the map above.

Getting From Moonbeam Base Area (Entry 1) to the Village:

You can ski to the village from the top of any lift on the mountain, but the quickest route on snow is to ride Link lift from Moonbeam base area, then simply ski down directly to the village. Legs giving out? Catch the Solitude Shuttle in front of the Moonbeam Lodge (12) and get a ride to the heart of the village (8). The Solitude Shuttle runs frequently during the winter, check for exact times.

Getting From the Village to Moonbeam Base Area (Entry 1):

You can easily ski to the Moonbeam area from the village. Walk across the village bridge towards Last Chance Mining Camp (10) and up the short hill onto Easy Street, a beginner run. Take the short run down. You can also catch the Solitude Shuttle directly behind the Stone Haus (8) and get dropped off in front of Moonbeam Lodge at Entry 1.

Getting Around in the Summer:

During the summer season, most activities are focused in the village. Parking at Entry 2 usually isn't a problem. If a large event requires you to park in Entry 1, the Solitude Shuttle will be operating to serve you. Also, if you are attending an event at Last Chance Mining Camp, the short summer path (slightly uphill) from the Entry 1 parking area makes a great summer stroll.
